



2002-2003 LEGISLATIVE SCORECARD

Summary of Major Bills that Passed Both Houses
with Legislators' and Governor's Voting Records

HOUSING

AB 1475 (*Steinberg*) Continues grants to local government or private nonprofits through the California Statewide Supportive Housing Initiative Act for supportive housing projects for mentally ill and other individuals and households with disabilities moving from emergency shelters or transitional housing or at risk of homelessness. Priority for funding will go to those projects that combine long-term housing with programs designed to assist the person's special needs. LAW

SB 345 (*Kuehl*) Among other things, this bill specifies additional information to be included in the notice that a landlord must give a tenant prior to entry. LAW

AB 304 (*Mullin*) The California Housing Finance Agency administers a down payment assistance program under which the amount of down payment assistance may not exceed 3% of the home sales price. This bill, among other things, authorizes the agency to establish higher assistance limits for down payment assistance to teachers and school personnel. LAW

HEALTH

AB 43 (*Daucher*) The Long-Term Care Integration Pilot Program authorizes 5 pilot programs around the state that integrate the financing and administration of long-term care services. This bill renames the program as the Chronic Care Integration (CCI) program, and establishes it as an ongoing program. VETO

AB 1528 (*Cohn*) Creates a 27 member commission to research and recommend appropriate and timely strategies for promoting high quality care and containing health care costs. LAW

SB 2 (*Burton & Speier*) Requires large employers (50+ employees) to provide insurance coverage or a fee for coverage for their work force and dependents beginning January 1, 2006. Medium employers (20 to 49 employees) will provide similar coverage beginning January 1, 2007, if a tax credit is enacted for this purpose. Small employers are exempt from the requirement to provide coverage and from the fee. It is estimated that about 1 million uninsured persons will obtain coverage through this bill. LAW

SB 24 (*Figueroa*) Simplifies enrollment into the Medi-Cal program for pregnant women and their newborns to promote better access to timely health services and to maximize federal matching service funds. LAW

SB 370 (*Soto*) Simplifies procedural access to renal dialysis treatment for eligible recipients with end stage renal disease. LAW

OLDER ADULTS & PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

AB 798 (*Committee on Aging and Long Term Care*) Existing federal law establishes the Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE), which provides specified services for older individuals so that they may continue living in the community. This bill establishes PACE program services as a covered benefit of the Medi-Cal program and authorizes contracts with up to 10 organizations to provide PACE services. LAW

CALWORKS/HUMAN SERVICES

AB 231 (*Steinberg & Lieber*) California has not exercised certain federal options that would make the Food Stamp program more responsive to the needs of working families. These include transitional food stamps, reduction of unnecessary welfare office visits, and an increase in the value of motor vehicles that food stamp households can own. This bill authorizes these options for California residents. It also removes the finger printing requirement which was determined by state audit to be cost-ineffective. LAW

AB 1668 (*Salinas*) The Child Care Facilities Revolving Fund provides funding for the purchase of new child care facilities and for renovation, repair, or improvement of an existing building to make it suitable for licensed child care and development services. This bill includes school districts or county offices of education that provides child care through the California School Age Families Education (Cal-SAFE) Program as applicants. LAW

FARMWORKERS

SB 75 (*Burton*) Eliminates the 2008 repeal of the law which provides mediation procedures between agricultural employers and labor organizations and sets out timely actions to move negotiations to completion. LAW

IMMIGRANTS

SB 60 (*Cedillo*) Expands the information that is acceptable when applying for a driver's license to include, in lieu of the applicant's social security account number, the federal individual taxpayer identification number, or other identifier or number that is deemed appropriate
